

MEDICAL CERTIFICATE

May 8, 2025

This is to certify that Miss Gemma B. Dela Cruz, 59/F from Quezon City has sought a consultation at the clinic due to a rash on her left upper arm for 5 days duration.

The patient had pneumococcal vaccine 8 days before the consult. After 3 days, the patient developed a rash and fever of 38C which was relieved by Paracetamol. The rash was in the same area as the vaccine. Initially, it was decribed as a slightly raised irregularly shaped reddish rash with surrounding areas also noted to be red but no swelling, no tenderness, no blisters or itchiness was stressed. The company physician advised bed rest, Claricort BID x1 day, and Aerius OD x 5 days. On the day of consultation, the patient remained afebrile, the rash was flat, eryhtematous patch with no blisters or vesicles, itchiness, wounds, tenderness, swelling, or pain.

Diagnosis: Dermatitis due to Pneumococcal Vaccine, resolving

The patient is well, non-febrile, and is cleared to go to work.
